FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Back by popular demand! Tuesday, October 8th at 6:30 we will begin offering The Alpha Course again at Emmanuel! You may remember hearing about this course when Vicar Tony led it this past year, but if you haven't attended yet, I would highly encourage you to make it a priority. If you already attended, then you know how wonderful an experience it is so why not bring a friend this time?

I have thought about what makes the Alpha Course different from everything else we do at church and I believe it has to do with asking questions. During the sermon, the pastor tells us about God's love or encourages us to live our lives according to God's Law. During GROW or Bible studies, we are learning what God has to say to us as well. At other times, we organize events to serve others or to plan for the future of our church. But how often do we, as congregation members, stop and simply ask *our* questions? When do we feel comfortable enough to admit our doubts in front of other people? When do we ever wonder out loud about the basics of faith or about the mysteries of the Holy Spirit? Not very often.

For that matter, how often do we take time to truly

listen to what people have to say? How often do we allow ourselves to ponder the questions that other people bring up rather than immediately trying to answer everything in just the right way? How often do we respect the questions others have and sit with them for a while rather than immediately demanding that everybody agree on the same answers right away before we begin to feel uncomfortable? Alpha is about wrestling with the hard questions faith brings up and working together to seek the answers. Through listening more than talking. Alpha is for long-time Christians, for people who wouldn't call themselves Christians at all and for everyone in between.

Philippians 2:3-4, "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others."

I was out shopping recently when I started speaking with a stranger about faith. She asked me where I was from and I told her that I was from Fontanelle where I was a pastor. She mentioned that she was a new Christian and was really enjoying the church she attended in Des Moines because they allowed her to ask questions without

making her feel badly about it. I asked her what she meant? How had she felt before? Her point was just that she didn't feel judged when she asked questions. Any question was allowed! And she didn't feel like she had to agree with the "right answer" by the end of a conversation. This made her feel both safe and excited to keep learning about Jesus!

I think that, if we are honest, we *all* have questions about our faith. Except that, most of the time, we feel embarrassed about asking them. Or, they are so out of the norm that we don't even want to admit that we wonder about them! The problem is that, when we never ask our questions, they eat away at our faith. Even if we never get an "acceptable" answer to a hard question, sharing our doubts can actually encourage our connection to a faith community! The Alpha Course is a time where people of *all* backgrounds are encouraged to listen to each other and discuss our individual faith journeys. *You* would be welcome there as would anyone you know. I hope that we have a great attendance this Fall for Alpha and that we can learn from our questions together.

Devotions were read by Pastor Broers.

The secretary's report for July 7th was read. Motion by Iris W., 2nded by Judi R. to approve the minutes. Carried. Motion by Judi R. to approve the secretary's minutes for July 21st. 2nded by Raedeen B. Carried.

The treasurer's reports were presented by George F. Motion by Judi R. to approve the reports. 2nded by Raedeen B. Carried.

Pastor Broers gave his monthly activities and mileage report. Motion by Judi R. to approve. 2nded by Leo W. Carried.

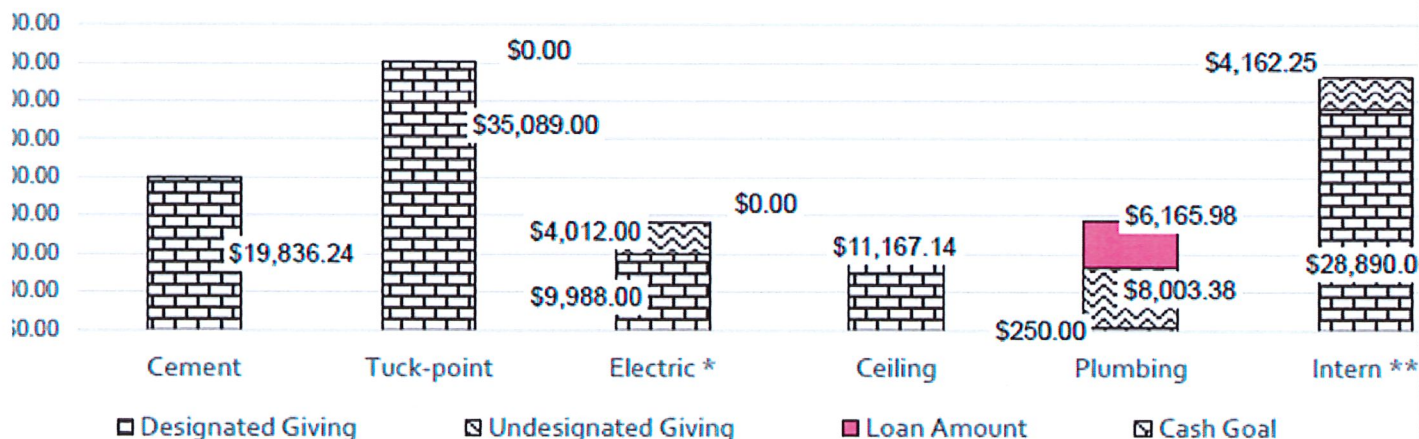
