FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

For many families, there are two big events coming up in May that are both big celebrations: Confirmation and Graduation. Unfortunately, sometimes the two are connected in ways that aren't always so wonderful. For some people, one of the last times they come to church regularly is in Confirmation so, in some regards, it's like they are "graduating" from church. A lot of parents begin to give their children the option to choose whether to come to church or not after they are confirmed and guess which option sleep-deprived teenagers choose early on Sunday mornings? However, just as we often see graduating seniors as just beginning their adult lives in the world, Confirmation has always meant to be just the beginning of a person's life in the church. Kristy recently found a great quote: "As a parent, it's my job to get you into Heaven, not Harvard."

One of my favorite parts of the Confirmation service is when I pray over each child. I am always struck by the fact that I am praying the same words over them as I do when I pray over them when they are baptized. In each instance, we ask God to fill them with the Holy Spirit to give them the power to live out their gifts as God calls them. These are the words I pray: "Daily increase in them your gifts of grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence." Just as baptism is the beginning of a person's walk with Jesus, Confirmation is a continuation of that journey as a child becomes an adult in the church.

But instead, after years of training these children about how to follow God and getting them ready to use their gifts, so often

they "graduate" to their beds on Sunday mornings. It would be as if our high school graduates finish their education and go directly back home to sit around on the couch all day. Not many parents would stand for that! We want them to go and spread their wings! Many will continue on to college and get even more education so that they are able to obtain the jobs that they want in the outside world. Others will immediately start to use their skills in the workforce. But hopefully very few will simply stop being involved in society altogether. In the church, we should begin to expect our young adults to start using their gifts immediately in the church and continue their education through the various adult spiritual growth opportunities such as ministry teams and Bible studies.

Do you have someone in your family who is a church dropout? Maybe someone reading this would even fit that description. I am sure that there are explanations or justifications, but understand that you are an important part of this church and God placed you here for a purpose. Our church will not work as God intended it to until you start living out the gifts that God has blessed you with. You were never meant to "graduate" church. You were always meant to become an integral member of the body of Christ. You were meant to continue to grow spiritually. And if I am simply preaching to the choir, consider encouraging other people in your life to start living out the promises that they made at their Confirmation and follow God into the ministry of the church. We can't wait to see how God wants to use you to bless the community with your gifts and talents!

E.L.C. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES—03/14/2021

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm by President Matt Gross.

Present were: Matt Gross, Craig Plymesser, Bill Ernst, Dan Dreyer, Samantha Gettler, Nellie Griffin, Iris Westphal, Pastor Steve Broers. Excused absence: Raedeen Bigelow

The agenda was amended by adding a closed session at the end for discussion of employee evaluations and salary adjustments.

Pastor Steve opened the meeting with devotions.

The minutes of the Feb. 21 council meeting were read and amended by stating that the Lenten services songs did not use hymnals but from a photocopied devotional. Motion to approve as amended by Iris W., seconded by Nellie G. and approved.

The minutes of the Feb. 21 reorganization meeting were read. Motion to approve by Bill E., seconded by Samantha G., and approved.

The treasurer's report was given by Bill E. Bill reviewed income and expenses with no irregularities reported. Finance Committee chair George Feazell reviewed progress with the PPP and EIDL funds received from Covid relief. Discussion followed. Motion to approve by Craig P, seconded by Iris W. and approved.

Pastor Steve presented his report. Motion to approve by Nellie G., seconded by Bill E., and approved.

Pastor Steve reported only one request for emergency benevolence for \$50.00 that was granted.

Pastor Steve, Raedeen B. and Bill E. will serve as the committee to review benevolence requests.

Committee Reports:

Alter Guild: Iris reported the group had met with new members and reviewed the plans for 2021.

Property: Dan reported that he and Matt G. had removed snow from the roof of the parsonage to remedy ice dams but that did not resolve a moisture issue in the house. It is now suspected that the clothes dryer vent does not exit the attic. Work will be done to remedy that situation. The clothes washer was replaced.

Music and Worship: Pastor explained there was a process issue with organist payments. After discussion, it was decided that organists should submit their time sheets to Iris Westphal, and Iris would forward to Barb Lemke (bookkeeper).

Children's Ministry: Samantha G. gave the report as follows.

Our deposit for last summer was moved to this summer and dates have already been booked for us. Some concerns are how to keep kids safe, volunteers safe, have the kids eat, what to do in case of rain since we need to be outdoors more, and what to do about a host family.

We find ourselves at the end of another G.R.O.W. year – one unlike any other we’ve had.
