FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Come and see!" This phrase is used twice in the Bible. Once when the disciple Philip says it and another time when Jesus says it. These three words can give us insight into how to share the gospel with others. It helps us distinguish between our role and God's role in salvation: what we are called to do and what God will do for us.

We see the words "come and see!" in the gospel of John chapter 1:43-46. Jesus tells Philip "Follow me" and just afterwards, Philip finds Nathanael and tells him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

"Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked.

"Come and see," said Philip.

Come and see. Those words changed Nathanael's life! Because when he came and saw Jesus, Jesus' words inspired Nathanael to become one of Jesus' twelve closest followers. I am sure that Philip probably wanted to share more with Nathanael, and maybe he even did, but that wasn't recorded in the Bible. The Bible tells us that all he needed to do was have Nathanael see Jesus and God would do the rest.

On June 12th, we are celebrating "Bring a Friend" Sunday. The idea behind this is to welcome visitors in a special way so that they might "come and see" who this Jesus guy is all about. Sometimes we feel like we have to have just the right words to explain to people what Christianity is all about. Sometimes we feel like we don't know enough or that people aren't coming to faith because of something we did or didn't do. However, this interaction between Philip and Nathanael reminds us that it is NOT up to us to "save" anyone. Our responsibility is to invite people to experience Jesus. God promises to take care of the rest. Feel free to tell people about Jesus anytime you'd like. Feel free to tell people about how

much you love your church. But, in the end, all you need to do is to tell people to "come and see" and let God do the work of creating faith.

And that brings us to when Jesus also said those same words, "Come and see!"

"The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, 'Look, the Lamb of God!' When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, 'What do you want?' They said, 'Rabbi' (which means 'Teacher'), where are you staying?' 'Come,' he replied, 'and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and spent that day with him." (John 1:35-39)

After this encounter with Jesus, those two men became two of Jesus' first disciples. One of them, Andrew, ends up inviting his brother Peter as well because they believed that they had found the God's chosen Messiah! All of this happened because they followed Jesus when he said, "Come and see!" What did they see? It must have been astounding because it changed their lives.

The disciples weren't just asked to put their faith in an idea. The SAW what Jesus did: He healed people, He delivered people from demons, He cared for the poor, He taught with authority. The SAW how Jesus lived His life: He spoke the truth and lived authentically and with integrity unlike so many of the religious leaders around Him. When you invite people to "come and see" Jesus, He SHOWS them what it means to be His follower. That He is NOT an idea to believe in but a real Savior that inspires others to put their trust in Him.

So invite your friends to church on June 12th to "Come and see!" what this faith community is all about. And then you can "come and see" how Jesus will change both your life and the lives around you through His power. Amen.

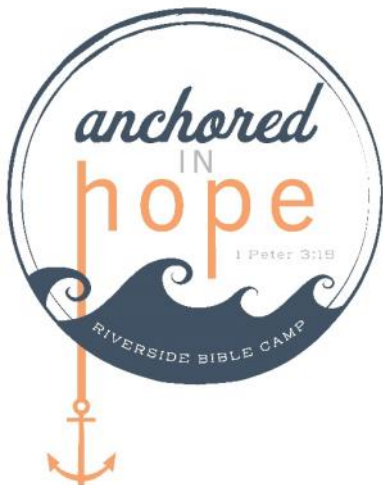

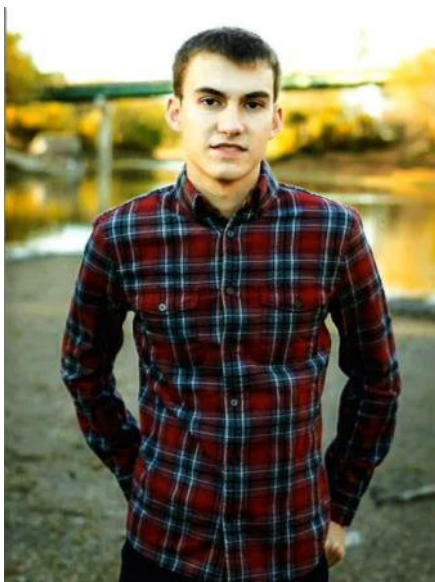

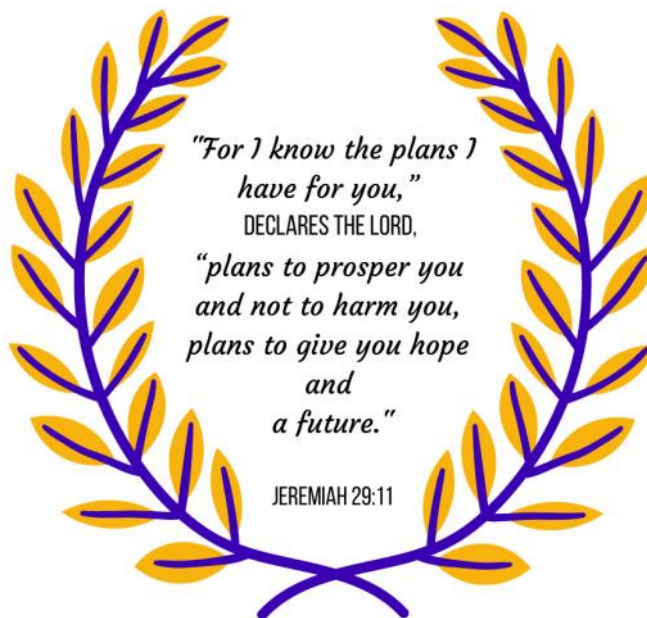
