FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

A few months ago, I was listening to a podcast that talked about starting a gratitude journal. The idea was that you would write down three things that you were thankful for each day. The speaker explained that, at first, she found it difficult to come up with three things but after about a week she was having to choose from many possibilities. I thought that it sounded like an interesting idea and started to do it myself. And just like she said, at first, I really had to think about three things that I could write down; however, after a couple of weeks, I had a whole list each night that I had to whittle down to three. I must admit that I don't always write down my list anymore, but I feel like getting into the habit of writing down what I was thankful for during that period of time has helped me to notice the positive things going on in my life every day since.

While I was at Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camp this summer with some of our Confirmation students, one of the daily lessons was about our faith being founded in joy. The skit that day dealt with the difference between happiness and joy. Being joyful doesn't always mean being happy because, as the scripture above puts it, we are called to be joyful always and, let's be honest, life doesn't always send us things to be happy about. Saint Paul wrote about being joyful even though he was put in prison for talking about his faith and experienced all kinds of problems ranging from shipwrecks to being stoned. But we can find joy even during difficult times by finding things that we are thankful for in our life. God is always at work

in our lives whether we are happy or we are sad; therefore, we can find joy in our lives in all circumstances and at all times.

Recently, I was running and not enjoying myself very much. It hurt, I was hot and sweaty and I wasn't going very fast. However, then I noticed the trees around me and the beautiful blue sky. I thought about my son, Stephen, and how much difficulty he has even walking around and how he would give anything to be able to do what I was doing right then and there. I thought about all the times I have been injured and been unable to run and, at that moment, I realized that I had a lot to be thankful for even on a difficult running day. I could find joy in my circumstances because God's gifts were still all around me. I just hadn't been able to notice them before.

I do not know what you are going through right now. It might be a terrible time in your house or a pretty happy time. You might easily be able to think about things to be thankful for or you might not be able to come up with three right now. But whatever your situation, I believe that it is worth it to pay attention to the blessings in your life so that you might be able to find the joy of the Lord as He is working in your life. We may not always see Him at work and we might not always notice His presence, but Romans 8:28 says, "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose." You might even start a gratitude journal to get in the habit of thanking God in all the circumstances that you find yourself in. I am thankful for each and every one of you reading this newsletter, for the church I serve here at Emmanuel and for a life blessed in countless ways by God who loves us and died for us so that we could live with Him in heaven forever. Amen.
