FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Everyone knows that they *should* read their Bible, but very few people do. Just like people know that they *should* exercise more, eat less sugar and go to bed earlier; still, very few people do any of that. Knowing the "rules" doesn't give you any greater ability to *follow* the rules I guess. Maybe, instead of thinking of daily Bible study as "eating your broccoli" you might focus more on *WHY* you would want to do it and *HOW* it might benefit your life in a positive way. What are the *rewards* in *your* opinion?

I have not always done a great job of studying my Bible, even as a pastor. Sometimes I get too busy and focus on getting things *accomplished* to the detriment of my relationship to God. You see, *that* is my biggest *WHY* when it comes to reading my Bible. I feel like God is speaking to me, directly, and trying to mold my life just like it talks about the potter molding the clay in Jeremiah.

For instance, when I am preparing a weekly sermon, I pray that God would speak through me to reach the people who are listening. I ask myself how to best express the biblical text to help others understand. When I read a passage, I ask how it might be heard by others or what our congregation needs to hear. But in my *personal* Bible study, I am *not* interested in what *other* people need to hear. I am asking God to change *ME*. And that changes a lot of things including how I read the text.

This past week, as I have been reading through the book of Proverbs, I ran across another gem. It said, "A fool finds no pleasure in understanding, but delights in airing his own opinions." (18:2)

When I hear people share their thoughts I instinctively want to share my own. I always think I have something interesting to add to any conversation!

Before our oldest daughter Sophia was born, Kristy and I attended something called the Childbirth Collective which focused on natural birth, nursing and attachment parenting. As they were discussing breastfeeding and delivery guess who had something really important to say? *ME!* Kristy laughed later as she told me that I was probably the only guy she knew who thought they had something important to add to a conversation about breastfeeding. But this passage in Proverbs showed me that it is not only funny, but it is a character flaw as well.

If I were just reading this for a Sunday, I might feel the need to share how often *ALL* of us focus more on our own opinions rather than on understanding others, but since I was reading it for personal benefit, there was no one to criticize but myself. Sharing my own opinions might feel really good and helpful, but I need to remember that most of the time nobody is asking me what I think! Instead, I am called to listen and try to better understand where *other* people are coming from. What do *they* think and what are *their* opinions? In the famous prayer by Saint Francis there is a line that says, "O Divine master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand."

Now, some of you may read this passage and get nothing out of it. You read this article and just hear a pastor "preaching" at you. But if you read the Bible yourself, if there was nobody else around, if you gave God a chance to speak to you, perhaps *you* might be changed just as I was. God's Holy Spirit has a specific message to give to each one of us and reading your Bible is a great way to enhance your ability to hear that message. His guidance, His love, His criticism, .

His compassion, His encouragement. Finally, I find it much easier to hear things directly from God in His Word rather than hear them from other people. If Kristy would have told me that I share my opinions too freely, it would have just felt hurtful. If my kids had told me, I might have just brushed it off. If a congregation member told me, I might have even gotten defensive! But personal Bible time is a sacred moment where God can speak to me when I can be vulnerable. This has been my experience, but I wonder what yours would be?

How might reading the Bible affect your life? Why might you want to try it? What rewards might you find in the pages of God's Word? How might God speak to you? I pray that you will all find out and be blessed in doing so. Amen.

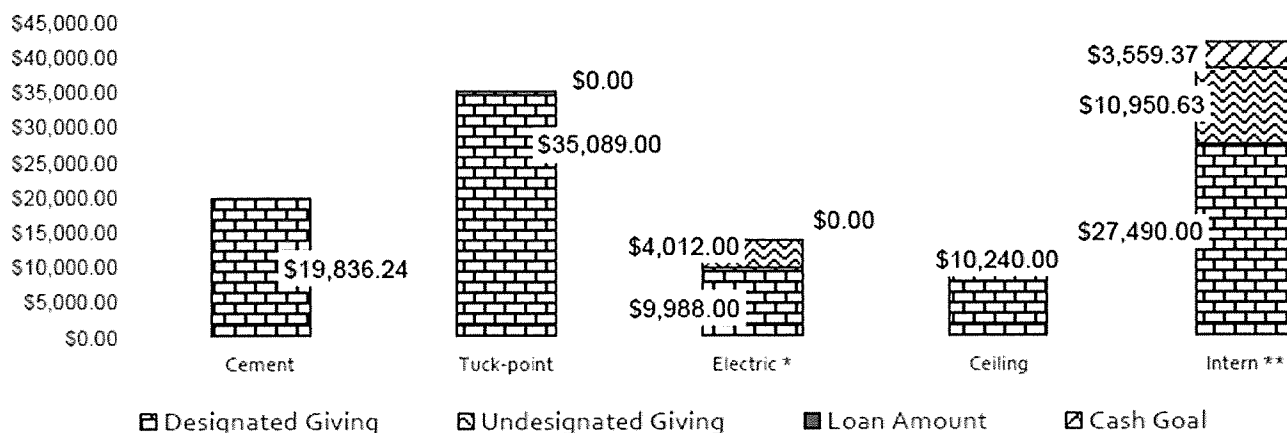
