

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This month, I want to share with you some thoughts about where God might be leading our church in the future. At the end of last year, our Council approved new Vision and Mission Statements. I want to share these with you so that you can learn them and pray about them. These statements were created so that you might better understand our purpose as a church, what we are doing to fulfill that purpose and how you can become involved in that work.

Our Vision Statement is easy to remember, but packed full of important insights! It's only six words, so it's not hard to memorize: "Come to Faith, Honor God's Word." Our church's reason for being is two-fold: First, we are called by the Holy Spirit to put our faith in Jesus Christ. Jesus said, "I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved." And we are not only called to come to faith ourselves, but we are encouraged to share that message so that others might come to faith in Jesus as well. This faith provides a full life here on Earth and also an eternal life with God in heaven.

When we come to faith, we are also filled with the Holy Spirit so that our lives are changed. We begin to honor God's Word in many different ways. God opens our eyes to see those in need all around us, "We love because He first loved us." The Bible becomes a guiding light for our lives and we start wanting to learn more about it. Hearing God's Word preached starts comforting us during difficult times and challenging us to live in a more Christ-like manner. Finally, we start seeking to glorify God because we have been witnesses to God's saving grace, "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." Come to Faith, Honor God's Word.

Everything our church does should be in service to this vision. Before we start a

program, or begin a worship service or support a ministry, we can ask ourselves some questions: "Will this help people come to faith?", "Does this ministry honor God's Word?" and "Does this ministry help us honor God's Word?"

Next, our Mission Statement explains WHAT we do as a church and HOW we accomplish the vision of coming to faith and honoring God's Word. It's a little longer, but I hope that you will join me in learning it. As a church, our mission is: "To be inspired and reconnected to God's Word and God's people, to share the message of the cross, and to bring God's love and healing to people in need."

We seek to inspire people and reconnect people to Jesus and the Bible in many different ways. Sermons, Praise songs, GROW lessons, Bible studies, hymns, newsletters, and devotions for example. Whether you come to in-person services or watch worship online, we are always working to communicate Jesus' message of justice, mercy and faithfulness to your life. But the church would not be the church without connecting to a community as well as learning from others and being inspired by their examples. This is why we have done all that we could to re-open church services as soon and as safely as possible and why we have tried to reconnect through "Thinking of You" cards and pastor's phone calls throughout the pandemic. What else might we do to inspire and reconnect to one another?

After learning about how much God loves you, it is only natural to desire to share the message of the cross with others. We seek to spread the message of Jesus' forgiveness both in person and through online resources such as the Facebook Live Bible study and GROW videos. What are some other ways we might reach out and share this message to people who have never

E.L.C. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES—12/13/2020

The regular meeting was held in the parish hall. President George Feazell called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm. Council members present were George F., Raedeen Bigelow, Lynn Christensen, Matt Gross, Bill Ernst, Iris Westphal, Dan Dreher, Pastor Steven Broers, and Roland Purdy. Absent was Nellie Griffith.

Pastor Broers led us in devotions.

The Secretary's Report was read by Roland Purdy. Motion by Raedeen B. to approve the minutes as read. 2nded by Iris W. Carried.

Treasurer's Reports were given by Bill E. and George F. Motion by Matt G. to approve the reports. 2nded by Iris W. Carried. The council has submitted a form applying for loan forgiveness for the \$20,118.35 PPP CARES Loan, since it is a "forgivable loan", when used properly. The \$8,000 EIDL Loan will be paid back.

Motion by Iris W. to approve writing checks for 4th quarter benevolence before the end of the year, basing December's benevolence on the first three Sundays offering and projecting for the month. 2nded by Matt G. Carried.

Pastor Broers presented his monthly mileage/ activities report. Motion by Bill E. to approve the report. 2nded by Raedeen B. Carried.

Emergency Benevolence: None

Committee Reports:

- Women of ELCA—they are meeting the 1st Wednesday of each month. There were 6 women at the last meet-
- 2. Altar Guild—poinsettias are ordered and should be at the church by next Sunday. All Christmas decorations are up at the church.
- 3. Property—the parsonage yard has been cleaned up. Matt G. asked for a list of projects still needing done at the parsonage.
- 4. Music & Worship—the Praise Team is practicing on Sunday nights for Christmas services, and is practicing social distancing and wearing masks.
- 5. Outreach—gift cards for \$10 each are being sent to local nursing home staff members in Fontanelle and Greenfield. There are a combined total of 96 staff members so the goal is to raise \$960. As of today \$595 had been raised.
- 6. Children's Ministry Report—December 2020 -GROW -The GROW kids have finished their journey through the Old Testament for the year and are beginning in the New Testament with the birth of Christ.

-Confirmation

-The Confirmation kids just finished oral testing of the Ten Commandments.

-High School

- -The Broers kids put up the Christmas tree this year so that social distancing and masks wouldn't be an issue.
- -Bible study continues.

-Children's Ministry

- -Kristy and Sophia are currently working on something that can be played as a "Christmas Program" during the traditional service.
- -There is no G.R.O.W./Confirmation/High School Bible Study during winter vacation.
- Stewardship—a stewardship letter is being sent to all active church members in December.

Old Business:

- 1. In-person-church services—bulletins will now be printed for both Sunday morning services.
- Vision/Mission statements—the council decided on new statements:

** Mission Statement

- --To be inspired and reconnected to God's Word and God's People, to share the message of the cross, and to bring God's love and healing to people in need.
- Pastor evaluations—are due this week (Dec. 13-19). Committee will meet to review. The Executive

- Pastor's Cell Phone—Pastor Broers has been in contact with Verizon to have the company explain the increase in monthly charges. The old cheaper plan is no longer available.

New Business:

- Survey results—the council reviewed the results of member surveys. Most member feedback was positive. The council supports Pastor Broers wearing a mask during his sermons until the coronavirus is no longer an issue.
- Nominating Committee—the three council members whose terms are up at the end of the year are George Feazell, Lynn Christensen, and Roland Purdy. The Council will search for candidates for council elections to be held in January 2021 at the Annual Meeting.
- 3. Annual Meeting January 17, 2021—will be held between services that Sunday morning.

Motion by Iris W. to adjourn. 2nded by Bill E. Carried. We adjourned at 7:54 pm with the Lord's Prayer.




