

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This summer I will be spending a lot of time at Ingham-Okoboji Lutheran Bible camp. We will be heading there for Family Camp one week and then I will turn around and go right back the following week for Confirmation Camp with seven of our Emmanuel youth. Many times, people talk about camp as a "mountaintop experience" because they feel so close to God there. All the songs, motivational testimonies from the counselors and being out in nature are so different than normal life that it feels like you never want to go back home! Home just doesn't seem as spiritually uplifting. Saint Peter felt that way when he traveled with Jesus up a mountaintop and saw Jesus transfigured right before his eyes. He wanted to build three shelters for Jesus, Elijah and Moses who had appeared before them. Peter never wanted to leave that place! But Jesus knew that there was much more for Him to do and so they needed to go back down. Once you've been on a mountaintop, everything seems like a valley, but it's not! It's just normal life and that is just as much where the kingdom of God exists as anywhere else.

But, when you think about it, the disciples were just as close to God at the bottom of the mountain as they were at the top because they were with Jesus the whole time! The experience might have been amazing up there on the mountaintop, but God was with them wherever they went. And isn't that true for us as well? We definitely FEEL like something special is happening when we go to camp and, of course, it IS a special place, but Jesus is with us as much in Fontanelle as He is at Okoboji. The point that I am trying to make is that God never changes, but WE get our eyes open and get made aware of God's presence much more clearly when we go to camp. We get reconnected to God at camp and, hopefully, we can take that wonderful

experience and remind ourselves that God is just as much with us every day and in every place we go all year long.

Have you ever had a mountaintop experience with God? A time where you felt so very close to Him? Maybe you went to a camp once, or a retreat, or a church service and felt energized and motivated to follow God and make a difference in the world for God's glory! I want you to recognize that you still can. Even years later, God is as much with you right at this very moment as He was on that mountaintop however long ago it was. The Lord spoke through the prophet Isaiah and said, "As the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth. It will not return to me empty but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it." If God spoke to you on that mountaintop and made you feel like He had a purpose for your life that applies as much down in the valley as it did way up there. And there is no time limit on God's call on your life.

I encourage you to take some time to have those mountaintop experiences. They are refreshing and memorable and exciting! But God calls us to follow Him and glorify His name every day of our lives and He is as close to us down here in the middle of life as He ever will be anyplace else. He will empower you to do whatever He has called you to do even if you don't FEEL capable. You don't NEED a mountaintop experience to be prepared for God to do amazing things through you. In fact, by seeking God's will and joining Him in His work on the Earth, you just might help create a mountaintop experience for others that you minister to. Amen.

E.L.C. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES-05/09/2021

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm by President Matt Gross

Present were: Matt Gross, Craig Plymesser, Bill Ernst, Dan Dreyer, Samantha Gettler, Raedeen Bigelow, Nellie Griffith, and Pastor Steve Broers. Guest: George Feazell. Excused absence: Iris Westphal

Pastor Steve opened the meeting with devotions, II Peter, Chapter 3.

The minutes of the April 11 council meeting were read. Motion to approve by Raedeen B., seconded by Dan D. and approved.

The treasurer's report was given by Bill E. Bill reviewed income and expenses with no irregularities reported. We appear to still be on budget for spending, with a few item variances but nothing significant. Income for the 1st quarter is lower than hoped for. Discussion followed and Bill was asked to investigate our "on-line" giving results. Motion to approve by Nellie G., seconded by Samantha G. and approved.

Pastor Steve presented his report, with no new activities. Bill E. motioned to approve, seconded by Raedeen B., and carried.

Pastor Steve reported no new requests for emergency benevolence. Raedeen B. offered information on a new program for assistance with utilities, rent, etc. and reminded the council to check with her office before committing to special requests for assistance. Raedeen thanked the congregation for their 1st quarter benevolence donation to Matura.

Committee Reports:

Property: Dan reported he was investigating clearing the South and West property lines of the parsonage. He will check on prices for removal, leveling, and a possible privacy fence. Removal of existing trees/shrubs and leveling will be difficult because of buried utility lines.

He also reported that he would like to organize a crew to finish clearing brush/trees from the East property line of the church on **Monday**, **May 17 at 10:00 AM**.

Matt reported that David Sickels, Bill Ernst and himself had repaired the dryer vent in the parsonage. The council would like to thank the team for their work.

Both Dan and Matt are working to obtain estimates for finishing the plaster and paint work in the sanctuary.

Women of the ELCA: no report

Alter Guild: A meeting has yet TBD for planning confirmation activities.

Music and Worship: No report

Children's Ministry: Samantha G. gave the report as follows.

GROW -GROW is finished for the year. We hope to be able to be back to a more normal year next year.
 Confirmation -Confirmation is finished for the year for all 7th graders. -3 of the 4 Confirmation students

will be confirmed on May 23rd. The other is still working to complete all the required work.

High School -Baccalaureate will be held this Wednesday, May 12th. Pastor Broers will be preaching.

Children's Ministry -VBS - Riverside made some changes and decided to have a 2-day VBS instead of the 1-day they had talked about previously. VBS will be held outside as much as possible, masks will be required, and students will bring their own lunches as well as snacks. We have a host family lined-up for the 4 counselors but are still seeking a preschool teacher as well as helpers.

Memorial: No report.

Stewardship: No report.

Outreach: There was good attendance at the pie social following the 1st service on May 11th for honoring Mother's Day and Senior graduates. Special thanks to Alyse Dreher and her mom for organizing and baking the pies!

OLD BUSINESS:

Livestreaming equipment: there will be a meeting this Thursday, May 13, to further refine the new system.

NEW BUSINESS:

Matt G. presented an offer from the Men of the Church to purchase new chairs. Matt will further investigate details on the number of chairs, storage issues, etc.

There have been requests about when the church will resume providing meals for funeral services. It was suggested that we set July 1 as a target date, but will need to discuss further pending volunteers, and state of the Covid 19 pandemic. Item tabled until the next council meeting.

Pastor will discuss with the youth of the church whether they will be serving food for the 4th of July service in the park.

The semi-annual meeting will be held on July 18th, between services with discussion on the agenda items. 2 items for consideration; delegates to the annual convention, and the 2022 budget.

Pastor will investigate rescheduling a photo directory for the church this fall.

Council would like to thank Amy Hoover for updating the church staff directory!

Craig P. moved at 6:44 pm to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Raedeen B. Motion approved.

President Matt G. closed the open meeting with the Lord's Prayer led by Pastor Steve.

longer be using the Intinction method of communion at the Contemporary service but instead using individual glasses. Thanks for your flexibility this past year in dealing with the changes, but we are so glad that things are almost all back to normal!

If you would still prefer to receive communion in your pew with the individually wrapped cups/wafers, we have them available at the entrance to the church. Also, if you still feel more comfortable worshipping from home, please let us know and we will place these communion kits in your mailbox at church so that you can participate in the communion service at home. Thanks!


