# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today's article will start with a quote from a book I am currently reading called *Run the Mile You're In* by Ryan Hall: "It took thousands of years for the first man to run a mile under four minutes, but after [Roger] Bannister did it in 1954, it started a cascade of world records in the mile run. Today, the world record stands at 3:43, and one man has even run back-to-back miles at a sub-four-minute pace. Today, it's fairly normal for an elite runner to clock a sub-four mile. To me, this is proof that once we cease to be impressed by the size of our challenges, our ability to overcome them grows exponentially."



Do you ever feel like you are facing impossible challenges in your life? With your family or at work? Do you look at our society and world and wonder how we could possibly overcome all the animosity simmering all around? God tells us that on our own we cannot overcome these things, but through faith in Him and by living according to His guidance, there will be a way forward. Jesus says, "In this world you will have trouble, but take heart! I have overcome the world!"

But what exactly does that look like? How are we to truly believe that it is possible? Thankfully, God has blessed us with the Bible. The Bible has multiple examples of how God has overcome challenges throughout history using normal people like you and me. Just like runners today look back at Roger Bannister, who broke the 4:00 mile, as proof that such a feat IS possible, we have the opportunity to look back at the stories of faithful people

throughout history to give us encouragement!

In the book of Hebrews, chapter 11, we see lots of examples of how God worked through people of faith throughout history: Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Moses are just a few examples. Before Moses' burning bush experience, I am sure that not a single Israelite believed that they would be rescued from their slavery to the Egyptians. Ten plagues later and they were on their way walking through the Red Sea! Centuries later, black slaves in America looked back at this story and found both hope and encouragement to find their own freedom from tyranny.

Are you worried about your financial situation? Find hope in the story of Joseph who was sold into slavery, put in jail and then, one day, became second only to the Pharaoh of Egypt! He was one of the wealthiest people in the country! Are you worried about standing up for what you believe in against persecution or naysayers? Remember the story of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego who took a stand for God against King Nebuchadnezzar and were thrown into a fiery furnace, only to be saved by God! Whatever challenge you are facing, you don't have to face it alone. God is always with you. And you aren't the first one to face these challenges either! Take courage from the many stories of how God has worked in people before you.

One final note of inspiration: When God works in your life, other people are watching you as well! When you accept God's call to follow Him and He defeats the challenges in your life, others see God at work and may just dare to do the impossible as well! Because, as the Bible says, "Nothing is impossible with God!" Amen.

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm by President Matt Gross

President Matt G. opened the meeting with a prayer.

The minutes of the June 13th council meeting were read. Some typos were corrected. Motion to approve as corrected by Dan D., seconded by Bill E. and approved.

The treasurer's report was given by Bill E. Bill reviewed income and expenses with no irregularities reported. Discussion followed. Motion to approve by Craig P., seconded by Nellie G. and approved.

George F. and Bill E. discussed the draft budget for 2022 and some adjustments to the insurance line item were made. Craig P. motioned to recommend the proposed budget to the congregation, Dan D. seconded and was approved.

A few members have taken steel chairs from the Parish Hall as offered at the June council meeting. Those remaining after July 18 will be donated.
