FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist" (Ephesians 6:10-11, 14a)

Why do human beings lie or deceive those around them? I believe one big reason is that they are trying to protect themselves. We lie to protect our reputation or to protect ourselves from being hurt by others. We lie to save ourselves money (protect our bank account) or to protect our own self-esteem. But the Bible says that it is honesty, not deceitfulness, that is truly the best protection against the evil in the world. Putting on the "belt of truth" is the first step in putting on the full armor of God.

Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32) In this passage, Jesus isn't referring to philosophical truth but to finding salvation through faith in His name. Jesus gives freedom from sin, not just freedom from ignorance. "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." (John 8:36) However, because God sees lying and deceit as sinful actions, there is a connection to truth in a philosophical sense here as well. Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:6) But when He speaks of the devil, Jesus says this: "When he [the devil] lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies." (John 8:44)

In my time as a pastor, I have found that there is truly nothing quite as "freeing" as being honest. I have felt it personally, but I have seen it often in others as well. When someone finally admits to a huge sin in their life, you can tell that it is one of the most scary things that they have ever done. Their guilt and shame is almost overwhelming as they confess the truth of their situation. However, once the truth has been let loose, all that fear seems to dissipate

quickly and a new future almost immediately unfolds. The devil loves to torment us not just with the threat of others finding out the truth of our sin, but with the guilt we feel by hiding that sin as well. Until we tell the truth, we face this torment alone; however, once we allow others to bear that burden with us, that sin loses much of the power it held over us. When we walk in the light of truth, we can much more easily fight against sin and temptation and ask for help from others who can both hold us accountable and also support us in our quest for freedom.

Do you struggle with lying? Or with exaggerating? What are your triggers? Do you worry about what others will think of you? Do you make a PLAN on what you are going to lie about or are spur-of-the-moment "white lies" more your style? When you lie or deceive someone, or yourself, how do you go about handling the situation? Do you stew over it for days or do you immediately confess it to someone you trust? Do you apologize immediately to the person you lied to or simply hope they didn't notice? What might happen if you made a commitment to be brutally honest with yourself and others? Do you believe it would hurt your relationships or is it possible it might actually help them? When you mess up, what can you do to help yourself ask forgiveness immediately and seek to do better next time?

We have all lied, exaggerated and tried to deceive people. It's a common sinful tendency. But confessing frees us from the guilt and shame and allows us to find freedom! "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (1st John 1:8-9) The best way to protect yourself is NOT by lying or deceiving others. Instead, telling the truth and admitting any lies immediately is the best way to protect yourself from harm, guilt and shame in the long run. Amen.

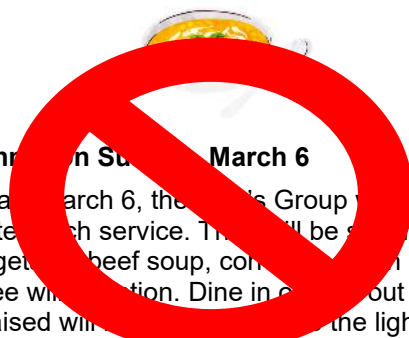
