my online Bible app about the importance of sharing our faith testimonies. One of the best ways to spread the message of Jesus is to tell people what He has done in your life. But as this devotional explained, sometimes we feel like our testimony isn't good enough because we don't have a long history of bad behavior. Sometimes we feel like our faith story is inadequate because we weren't addicted to drugs and alcohol or had some other type of horrible life circumstances before we became a Christian. Sometimes the story is that we were brought up in the church, were baptized, confirmed and then just kept going through to adulthood. The devotional said that while colorful stories are certainly inspirational, EVERY story of faith is worth listening to and can be just as motivating for people to hear.

Remember that we plant seeds of faith and allow God, the Holy Spirit, to do the work of leading people to Jesus. Saint Paul makes this very point in the third chapter of 1st Corinthians, "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who makes things grow." Don't get caught up in what YOU think people want to hear, just share with them what God has done for you. Don't start worrying about whether your story is too boring to inspire anyone, God's Word works when and where God pleases to turn the hearts of people to faith in Him. "As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth. It will not return to me empty but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it." (Isaiah 55:10-11)

you have is just being yourself and telling your God story. Your life experiences might seem unimpressive in your eyes, but it might be exactly what someone else needs to hear. Just your willingness to talk about faith with someone can be inspiring because so often people think of faith as a private matter. Many testimonies are stories about how God saved a person FROM something; however, a testimony also can be a story about what God saved us FOR!

The story of Easter is the testimony about what God saves us FOR. When the disciples heard that Jesus was alive again after being dead, it was like their entire perspective on life changed. While days earlier they were worried about being killed by Roman soldiers who might connect them with Jesus; now they went out into the streets confessing that not only were they Jesus' friends but that HE was their Lord and the Savior of the world! They felt inspired because they didn't need to be afraid of anything anymore . . . not even death. Jesus had proved that nothing that people can do here on Earth can stop a follower of God from living out his or her purpose. The disciples weren't just grateful for being saved from their sin, they were inspired to tell others about what a life of faith could give them.

Don't be afraid, embarrassed or complacent with your God stories. Share them with other people, both family and friends, so that they can see clearly that God has worked and IS working in your life. God might be planning on using YOUR story to bring them to faith in Jesus. Not just because of the horrible things God has saved you FROM, but for the exciting new life that God has raised you FOR!

This Easter, ask God to reveal what His plans are for your life. What did He save you FOR anyway? WHO did He save you for? How has God changed your life so that you might serve others? These types of testimonies are not only important but they can be life changing for everyone! Amen.
