FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness, who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter. Woe to those who are wise in their own eyes and clever in their own sight." Isaiah 5:20-21

I have heard the term "gaslighting" a lot in the last few years and I never really understood what it meant until recently. It's a term that refers to psychological manipulation where a victim is fed false information deliberately and systemically until they begin to question their reality and even their own identity. The goal of gaslighting is to control a person so that they doubt themselves and their own understanding of the world.

I believe that Christians especially are being "gaslit" by the culture we live in. Things that our society has always accepted as true in the past are now not only being questioned but are said to have completely changed. Many people argue that there is no such thing as objective "truth" anymore; instead, "truth" is based on each individual's interpretation. It's important to recognize when this is happening and push back on the idea that things have changed when they really haven't. Christians believe that truth is decided by God alone and we live according to that truth.

For example, many people today argue that there are no longer only two genders but thousands of possibilities. Furthermore, it is argued that being male or female is no longer

a fact but can be decided by each individual person and how they self-identify. This self-identification can change over time. I believe that there is a very clear biological argument against this concept of gender identity, but there is a biblical one as well.

Genesis 1:27 says, "So God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them." The Bible only speaks of two genders. In Genesis 25 in the account of Jacob and Esau, the Bible says, "Esau became a skillful hunter, a man of the open country, while Jacob was a quiet man, staying among the tents." Esau might have been considered to have more "masculine" qualities because he was hairy, liked to work outside and enjoyed hunting while Jacob might have seemed more feminine because he hung out with the women in the tents and had smoother skin. But while they had different personality traits, they still shared the same gender: they were still men. Eunuchs, men who had been castrated, were still considered men even though they did not have all the male biological parts anymore. In contrast, today's society would argue that if you were born a biological male, but feel feminine and have surgery to remove your male body parts, you can now be considered a woman. The Bible just doesn't support that type of self-understanding.

Again, Christians believe that our worldview is based on Biblical truth rather than on our own perception of reality. This applies to many areas of our lives—not just questions

President Gross opened the meeting with a prayer.

Craig read the minutes from the June 12 council meeting. Motion to approve minutes as amended was made by Bill and seconded by Dan Berg. Motion carried.

Gini presented the Treasurer's report. She reported that everything is rolling along smoothly. Gini presented the proposed benevolence giving for 3rd qtr. Gini made the motion to approve, 2nd by Bill and carried. Bill moved to approve the treasurer's report and Dave seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Matt presented the Pastor's report for the month of June. Bill moved to approve the report and the expense reimbursement and Gini seconded the motion. Motion carried. Discussion followed on raising the mileage rate due to high gas prices. Council will act on a motion at the next council meeting.


Monthly schedules are found in the newsletter, posted in the parish hall and entry, and posted on the church website.
