FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

*"Now may the Lord of peace
himself give you peace at all
times and in every way.
The Lord be with all of you."*

- 2nd Thessalonians 3:16

As I write this newsletter message, I am in isolation after testing positive for Covid-19. At first, I didn't feel very well, but by day four in isolation I feel fine. I am getting enough sleep. Getting a lot of reading done. Doing devotions. Watching movies and shows. Making some phone calls. Being waited on hand and foot. Yet still struggling sometimes about my life...why?!

I think I have a difficult time being at peace. I am not used to peace. I keep feeling like I should be doing something else, getting more done, or feeling guilty. My first instinct when faced with peace is to get rid of it somehow! When things are too quiet, I want to fill the silence with music or talking or a show or something!

On the one hand, I often seek peace during my normal life. I say things about wanting to just take a break. Or needing a nap. And yet, to be honest, sometimes I don't take advantage of the peaceful times during my day and just fill them with something I needed to get done or with something I find entertaining. How often does God provide peace in my life and I've never even noticed because I am too busy pushing that peace away?

One of the most famous passages in all of scripture is from Psalm 37, "Be still and know that I am God." In order to find peace, it's not so much about what we are doing to find it but what we are NOT doing to just let it happen. If you feel overwhelmed and stressed at work, perhaps you don't need to read another self-help book about finding more time or watching a YouTube video about how to be more present with your family. Instead, turn off your phone and put down your book and just BE. And stay that way even if it feels uncomfortable.



That's peace. And peace can sometimes feel quite uncomfortable at first. Stressful even. Cause it's something that we are not used to. But if you trust God to bring it and are still throughout the experience, you may start to enjoy being at peace and stop fighting against it. And this may help you find a deeper and more fulfilling relationship with yourself, your family and, most importantly, with God. Amen.

The regular council meeting was called to order at 5:01 p.m. by President Gross. Present: Matt Gross, Bill Ernst, Dan Dreher, Dan Berg, David Huff, Gini Herr, and Craig Plymesser, and Pastor Steve Broers.

Pastor Broers opened the meeting with devotions from 1st Thessalonians.

Craig read the minutes from the July 12 council meeting. Motion to approve minutes as read was made by Dan Dreher and seconded by Dan Berg. Motion carried.

Gini presented the Treasurer's report. She reported that everything is rolling along smoothly and some of the property maintenance bills were paid. George explained how funds utilized to pay bills are organized in the General Fund. Craig Plymesser moved to approve the treasurer's report and Bill Ernst seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor's report for the month of July was discussed. Mileage reimbursement will follow IRS guidelines. There were no emergency funds requested. Gini Herr moved to approve the report and the expense reimbursement and Dan Dreher seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The council accepted Mike Mangels resignation as custodian of the Sunday school rooms and the lower level. Mike will continue to assist with snow removal and projects as requested. Motion made by Craig Plymesser, 2nd by Bill Ernst to accept the resignation as presented. Carried. A motion was made by Gini Herr, 2nd by Dan Dreher to, on behalf of the congregation, extend a heartfelt thank you to Mike for his years of service. Carried.

Craig Plymesser discussed leading a discussion group on "The Chosen" movie series. Council agreed to utilizing Outreach funds to purchase study guides, and to begin the group on September 4th, 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm.

Motion to adjourn at 6:28 p.m. was made by Dave Huff and seconded by Dan Berg. The motion carried.

President Gross closed the meeting with the Lord's prayer.

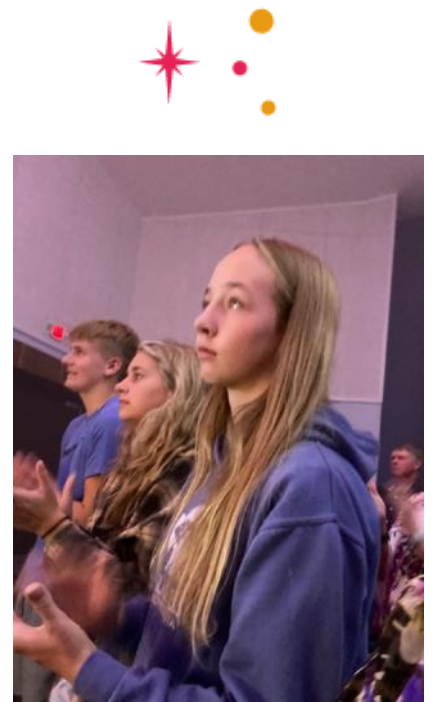

-School Supplies (pens, pencils, crayons or markers, pencil case, small notebooks, solar powered calculator, safety (blunt tip) scissors, ruler, glue stick, small adhesive tape, etc.)

-Toys (Small cars, balls, ball air pumps, glove and baseball, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch-a-Sketch, marbles etc.)

-Hygiene Items (mild bar soap, comb, washcloth, adhesive bandages, reusable plastic cups & bowls, nail clipper, stick deodorant, washable/reusable cloth menstrual pads, etc.)
