FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Starting in January, our church will be experiencing the Bible from beginning to end through a year-long worship focus on The Bigger Story of scripture. The last few years have pulled us ALL into the smaller stories within our lives—political stories, health stories, family stories, community stories—but these stories have often divided us rather than united us as Christians. This upcoming year, we want to remember The Bigger Story that swallows up all those smaller stories—a better story. We tend to look at The Bible as a bunch of small passages that are separate from one another, but we are going to look at The Bigger Story and see how all the whole narrative points to Jesus! And once we learn The Bigger Story, it will be easier for us to find our place within that story as well.

You may have a hunger for knowing and doing God's Will but you aren't sure how to learn what that is? We find those answers in the pages of the Bible. You may have a hunger for God's Word, but don't feel equipped to read and understand it . . . that's why we are going to do this together! We are going to start in the Old Testament with the book of Genesis in January and finish up in the book of Revelation by December but, obviously, we will not be able to go verse by verse throughout the year. My goal as a preacher will be to give you a good overview of the whole story and to focus on the highlights throughout the year. However, I would encourage you to take this opportunity to go deeper on your own either by joining a Bible study offered here at church or by focusing on reading through the Bible in a year using the Bible Reading Schedule for 2023 that is available at Emmanuel. The daily readings within the Bible will hopefully begin to make a lot more sense to you as you begin to see the arc of the whole story

from beginning to end.

As I mentioned earlier, in January we will begin by focusing on the book of Genesis. We will hear how God created the world and everything in it as well as how sin entered into the world. We will then hear how God called Abraham and gave him the promise of becoming the father of as many nations. However, by the end of January, we will already be in the book of Exodus hearing about how God freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and then how He gave them the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai. By Ash Wednesday at the end of February, we will be learning about how the Israelites were taken into Exile by the Babylonians and begin our transition into the New Testament. Throughout Lent, we will learn all about Jesus and the many Old Testament prophecies that He fulfilled during His life, ministry and death on the cross. Every week will be packed full so you won't want you to miss even a little!

My hope is that during this upcoming year, you will begin to find your place within The Bigger Story of scripture. I want you to be able to form a mental outline of the most important people, places and events referred to at church. I want you to recognize how connected the Old and New Testaments are and understand the place of Jesus within the overall story from beginning to end. I hope that you begin to see how the doctrine you learned in Confirmation class comes directly from scripture and how the themes we hear about throughout the church year always come straight from the Bible as well.

I hope that you enjoy going through The Bigger Story of scripture and that it becomes not only YOUR story but OUR story as a congregation focused on Coming to Faith and Honoring God's Word.

The regular council meeting was called to order at 5:04 p.m. by President Gross. Present: Matt Gross, Bill Ernst, Dan Berg, Dan Dreher, David Huff, Gini Herr, Craig Plymesser, Samantha Gettler, Louise Johnson and Pastor Steve Broers.

Pastor Broers opened the meeting with devotions on making disciples.

Craig read the minutes from the September 11 council meeting. Motion to approve minutes as read was made by Dan Dreher and seconded by Dan Berg. Motion carried.

Gini presented the Treasurer's report. Discussion on the Memorial committee paying for the registration fees for campers at Okoboji this past summer. The church has already paid for the first half of the registration fees. All other finances are in excellent condition. Dan Dreher moved to approve the treasurer's report and Dan Berg seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The Poinsettia
