FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

At the very end of the eleventh chapter of the gospel of Matthew, we hear Jesus' words to His followers: "Come to me all you who are weary and heavy burdened and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." Jesus invited people to be a part of His life and He gave them a lot of love and encouragement. I believe that our church needs to emulate that same attitude to the world around us and the way that happens is for you, the people of the church, to be welcoming and inviting to the people in your life.

Yet, just a few chapters later, in Matthew chapter sixteen, Jesus says something very different to His disciples, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will find it." Jesus challenged the people following Him, the people with close personal relationships to Him, in meaningful ways to live their lives in a radically new way when it came to their faith. I believe that our church also needs to emulate that kind of attitude to the world around us. And the way that happens is also for you, the people of the church, to hold one another accountable and challenge each other to live out your faith wherever you study, work, play and live.

In Mike Breen's book, <u>Building a Discipling</u> <u>Culture</u>, he maintains that churches often fall far short of God's intention for us to be a place where people are empowered in their faith. Sometimes we lean far too much into just being a cozy place where sinners feel welcome but are never held accountable for their sinful behaviors or challenged to live a new life worthy of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Other times, churches focus only on what God demands of them and place expectations on their members that make it feel like God is

a taskmaster with little love or compassion. In the worst cases, many churches are both boring (no challenge for people to change their lives) and apathetic (no desire to invite people into a relationship with God or anyone else). The sweet spot is for us to both be very invitational to people and also be willing to challenge them in their journey of faith. How might Emmanuel be this type of church?

Lent is a great time to do some self-reflection. We are called by God to repent of our sins and seek to change our lives to look more like His—that is a great challenge! However, the story of Jesus' passion, how He gave His life for sinners, is a wonderful reminder that He has compassion for the lost and the unrighteous. This can be both a comfort to us and to those we might come into contact with. How do you feel this balance in your own life or in your ministry here at Emmanuel?

For example, are you only happy when you hear sermons about forgiveness but cringe when I talk about turning away from sin? When you help at GROW, are you only focused on getting the kids to sit still and learn their lesson or are you also paying attention to what is going on in their lives? When was the last time you called someone up from church and told them you have been missing them at worship services? When was the last time you invited a stranger to join us at worship services? We all tend to lean one way or another when it comes to challenge and comfort and yet they are both important aspects of our culture here at Emmanuel. Are you in a season where you need to hear comforting words from God or a challenge to action from the Holy Spirit?

I hope that these questions will lead to more conversation about how we can become a discipling culture where we come to faith, invite others to faith, honor God's Word and challenge others to do the same. Amen.

5 REASONS TO SEND YOUR CHILD TO BIBLE CAMP

It's still winter and we're just starting to climb out of the bitter cold of the Polar Vortex, so why am I even thinking about summer Bible camp?! Because now is the time to get your children registered!

The times I spent at Bible camp were the most influential times in my life AND in my faith development. I wouldn't be the person I am today without the influence of Bible camp. If you didn't experience Bible camp as a child or teen, you may wonder how it can really be that important. I mean, can't children receive the same benefits in summer programs through Vacation Bible School.

Here are five reasons why you should send your child to Bible camp this summer:

1. Concentrated Time in God's Creation

Camps are intentional about spending most of the day outside, immersed in God's creation. This is a time to escape the pressures of everyday life (and detox from screens) in an amazing environment!

2. Concentrated Time in Spiritual Conversations

During each day of Bible camp, your child is included in several times of intentional spiritual conversations: morning devotions, cabin devotions, and chapel time. As our culture moves farther away from the knowledge of God, these very visible times of faith applied to "all of life" becomes even more important.

3. New Friends and Role Models

If recent times has taught us anything, it's that relationships matter...and in-person relationships matter the most. One week at Bible camp is like one year (or more) in "real" life. The intensive time together and the abundance of shared experiences grows relationships quickly.

4. New Experiences

Bible Camp is a great place to try new things. Campers are in a new environment and with people they don't know from "regular" life. This gives them the freedom to "re-invent" themselves through new experiences.

An introverted child will make many new friends. A timid child may choose to try the high ropes course or go all in for water activities. A "non-athletic" child may excel at the crazy camp games. All these new experiences will give your child a broader view of themselves and increase their confidence.

5. Fosters Independence (In A Safe Environment)

While cabin leaders are a very active and integral part of your child's life at camp, there is still the independence gained from being away from home and parents for an

extended time. Children are able to make choices and try new things that they may not while a parent is around. They also experience the natural consequences of their actions (in a safe environment): lost water bottles, sand in the bed, poison ivy, a belly ache from too much candy, etc.


