FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

May 2023

"Come to me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." - Matthew 11:28-30

May is Mental Health Awareness month. There is a lot of stigma surrounding mental health especially in the religious community. Sometimes Christians feel confused about how to reconcile their understanding of mental health issues alongside their belief in Jesus and what the Bible says. For instance, how do we understand an anxiety disorder while at the same time believing that Jesus tells us not to worry? What are we to do when we feel depressed and then read the scripture passage that tells us to "Be joyful always!"? How can we talk about suicide both from a prevention standpoint but also with a deep compassion for those whose lives it has touched? Is it okay to be sad when a loved one dies or should we be happy that they will be in heaven because of their faith in Jesus?

While I cannot address all of the questions surrounding these important mental health questions, I think it is extremely important that we recognize this: God cares as much about your mental health as He does about any other area of your life. Jesus healed people with both physical and emotional concerns. Jesus once said, "I have come that they might have life and have it to the full!" When someone is struggling with their mental health, they are unable to live the full life that God desires for them. Prayer is a really powerful thing to do to help all of us cope with the stress in our lives, but God has also provided counselors, therapists, psychologists, psychiatrists and doctors to help us through difficult times. We don't need to feel guilty for asking for help either from God or from people who are trained to deal with these issues.

Another great resource for Christians dealing with mental health is the Bible. The book of Psalms is filled with cries for help from people dealing with anger, anxiety and depression.

"Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord; O Lord, hear my voice." (Psalm 130:1) "Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise Him, my Savior and my God." (Psalm 42:11) "Save me, O God, for the waters have come up to my neck. I sink in the miry depths, where there is no foothold. I have come into the deep waters; the floods engulf me. I am worn out calling for help; my throat is parched. My eyes fail, looking for my God." (Psalm 69:1-3) Verses like these should encourage us to believe that, yes, people of faith can and do deal with these issues. And God cares.

In John 11, we read how Jesus dealt with the death of His friend Lazarus, "When Jesus saw Mary weeping and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, He was deeply moved in spirit and troubled, 'Where have you laid him?' he asked. 'Come and see Lord,' they replied. Jesus wept." Jesus certainly had faith in God His father and had hope in a resurrection because, in just a few verses, Jesus would raise Lazarus from the dead! And yet, Jesus cried because He was still sad in the face of death. Grieving is a natural and healthy process. However, as 1st Thessalonians puts it, "We do not grieve like the rest of men who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in Him." (1st Thessalonians 4:13-14)

Some of you are dealing with mental health issues right now, and I want you to recognize that God cares about your suffering and loves you. There is no place for guilt or shame when it comes to mental health just like you wouldn't feel guilt or shame for having heart health issues (ex. heart blockages) or brain health issues (ex. dementia) or metabolic health issues (ex. diabetes). Please do not suffer in silence. God provides great strength and hope, but it is also important that you reach out to family, friends and professionals to get the help and support that you may need right now. Amen.

IA LCMC MEETING-4/17/2023

Pastor Broers attended an LCMC lowa District Board meeting at Trinity Lutheran Church in Ellsworth, lowa on Monday, April 17th from 4-6:30. The meeting began with a short devotion on dealing with anxiety by using the acronym C.A.L.M. (Celebrate God's goodness, Ask God for help, Look on the bright side, Meditate on the good). Our district coordinator, Stephen Anenson, spoke about the work he has been doing with Nazareth Lutheran church of Cedar Falls which is considering affiliating with LCMC, helping with conflict resolution at a couple of churches and leading worship at various churches in a supply pastor role. Stephen will be attending the Leadercare retreat May 8-11 and the District Coordinator Conference.

We covered many topics such as setting up a presence at Waldorf college, the upcoming Leadercare retreat, the wording of the lowa District mission statement and the possibility of setting up a League of Rural Lutheran churches. The most time was spent discussing the future of

the Iowa District Coordinator position and changing the job description to better reflect the additional time spent doing the job. Originally, the coordinator was expected to work one day a week for about eight hours, but Stephen has been working about twice that much. We discussed the importance of the coordinator being a good resource for Iowa congregations as well as a one-on-one support for pastors. We expect future expansion as LCMC moves into LCMC 3.0. We approved an increase in the coordinator stipend to reflect the additional work being completed and will continue to discuss updating the job description.

It was a great day to get together and see colleagues while discussing how we can better support the churches of the LCMC Iowa District. The next meeting will be held Monday, August 7th at 4:00 at Trinity in Ellsworth since it is a location that is central to the participating members of the board.


